The results will not be available until the Ontario Labour Relations Board has resolved the contested issues raised by both Foodora and CUPW.

The only question is: what will it take to get Foodora to bargain with us collectively? A lot of eyes are on Foodora right now, and they'd be better off to recognize us and come to the negotiating table so we can work together to solve our issues" — Alexander Kurth, Foodora courier and union organizer.
