Barrette, Renée Thiboutot, Sébastien Bélisle, Louis Côté and Yves Dubé. A quorum was reached. The meeting was chaired by Mayor Normand Houde.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, in 2014, the federal government will look at how it handles public postal services;

WHEREAS Canada Post is preparing for this review by initiating major service cuts and may even lay the groundwork for privatizing or deregulating the postal service; WHEREAS Canada Post has already made enormous cuts to service by closing or downsizing public post offices, eliminating delivery to some rural mailboxes and reducing the number of street letter boxes;

WHEREAS these closures and/or service cuts are contributing to the devitalisation of rural areas and further isolating seniors and the disabled;

WHEREAS the federal government and Canadians favour developing ways of ensuring that seniors can remain in their own homes;

WHEREAS seniors worked tirelessly to build our region, province and country, and, as stated by Prime Minister Harper, the Canadian government has a duty to take measures to improve their quality of life, not the opposite;

THEREFORE, it is moved by Councillor Renée Thiboutot, seconded by Councillor Yves Dubé, and resolved to make representations to Stephen Harper, Prime Minister of Canada, so that all steps are taken to ensure the maintenance of door-to-door mail delivery by Canada Post, in the best interests of Canadians.
