

The Canadian Union of Postal Workers has serious reservations about CETA, including what our government is doing with postal services.

Canada is negotiating less protection than the European Union (EU) in CETA negotiations.

Canada has taken an Annex I reservation for postal services while the European Union has taken a stronger Annex II reservation.

An Annex I reservation would lock in our government's decision to deregulate international letters and also lock in this or any future government's decision to further deregulate Canada Post.

An Annex II reservation would give our government the policy flexibility to take measures, such as reversing postal deregulation that is not working. That's what the EU wants and what we should be negotiating.

We should also be insisting on protections for public services in general and an end to investor-state provisions that allow corporations to challenge the laws, policies and programs of our country.

Reform CETA or get rid of it.
